- 2. Lokhuzyen and his boys' ordeal began when he took a wrong turn during a road trip from his home in Brisbane to Cairns using an inland route and his vehicle got trapped in mud.
- 3. "They were pretty hungry by the time I got to them, and pretty happy to see me. The younger boy kept asking me if I had any eggs, while the older one appeared dehydrated," Wagner said.
- 4. Queensland Police Acting Superintendent Mick Bianchi said that the boys were listed stable at the Taroom Hospital and were getting their strength back.
- 5. "During their ordeal, the trio had limited provisions and the father had given the limited food to his sons. Luckily, it was stormy at times and they were able to collect rainwater in a plastic container. Otherwise, they would have perished, "said Bianchi.
- 6. He applauded the father for key decisions during the ordeal- one, to stay near the vehicle; two, to attract attentions by laying out high visibility items around his vehicle; three, to stay warm by lighting fires; and four, to establish routines with his children and keep them occupied.
- 7. He said that the National Park is not usually visited at this time of the year because of the extreme weather conditions and there is usually little or no cell phone reception there in the area, so the trio were not able to contact anybody for help.
