



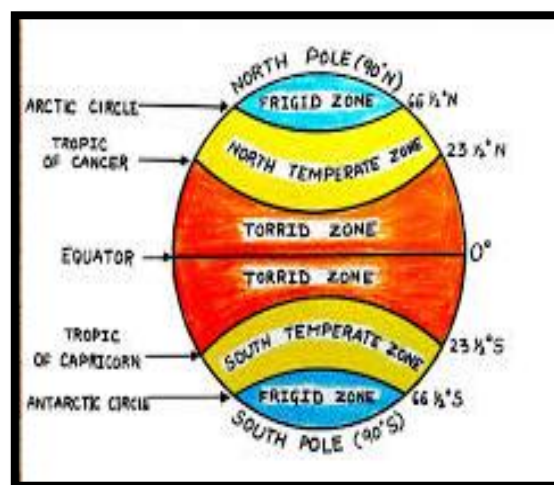

Q1. Ans	<p>In how many heat zones can the Earth be divided into? Explain any one zone. Draw and label the diagram of Heat Zones of the Earth.</p> <p>On the basis of difference in rainfall and temperature, the Earth can be divided in to three climatic or heat zones which are as follows :</p> <p>Torrid Zone: It lies on both sides of the Equator and extends upto the Tropic of Cancer in the north and the Tropic of Capricorn in the south. It is also called Tropical Zone. Areas falling under this zone remain hot and humid all through the year as the Sun's rays fall directly over these areas.</p> <p>Temperate Zone: In Northern Hemisphere, this zone lies between the Tropic of Cancer and the Arctic Circle and in the Southern Hemisphere this zone lies between the Tropic of Capricorn and the Antarctic Circle. Areas falling in this zone are neither very hot nor very cold because the Sun's rays do not fall directly over them.</p> <p>Frigid Zone: This zone lies between the Arctic Circle and the North Pole in the Northern Hemisphere and in the Southern Hemisphere between the Antarctic Circle and the South Pole. Areas falling under this zone remain very cold throughout the year because they do not receive any direct sunlight.</p>
