Palak agreed. She performed in the busy Rajwada area of Indore, on a stage made of trolleys. "I collected ₹55,000, enough for Lokesh's treatment."
- 4. District Child Welfare and Women Development Officer Vishal Nadkami, who is also nodal officer for heart operations in government hospitals, says, "Palak has indeed happily sponsored some operations set up by them." Palak also works as a bridge for an NGO run by film actor Salman Khan.

An Indore based cardiac surgeon, Dr. Manish Porwal says that Palak's contribution has been significant. He says, "It's due to her efforts that many poor kids could be treated at some of the big hospitals of the country."
