2. When the factory processes cotton into cloth, it adds extra value by changing its form into something useful and attractive.
3. Finished goods like cloth are sold at higher prices, especially when exported to other countries.

Thus, the secondary sector usually earns more profit than the primary sector.

Q7. Can you think of some actions that responsible citizens might take to help their area of the city?

Answer: Some actions that responsible citizens might take to help their area of the city are as follows:

1. Planting and taking care of trees.
2. Using cotton and jute bags instead of plastic bags.
3. Complete switchover to LED lights and increasing the usage of Solar Energies.

Answer: Interdependence between primary, secondary and tertiary sectors:

Example: Making bread.

- Primary Sector: Farmers grow wheat.
- Secondary Sector: Factories turn wheat into bread.
- Tertiary Sector: Shops sell bread, transport delivers it, banks provide money.

Flow Diagram:

Primary Sector (Farmer grows wheat)



Secondary Sector (Factory makes bread)



Tertiary Sector (Shop sells bread, transport delivers)
