9Q.Describe the main features of permanent settlement and also write its drawback.

Ans-**Permanent settlement** - This system of revenue collection was introduced in 1793 by the British company. The main features of permanent settlement were-

- 1. The Rajas and taluqdars/zamindars were asked to collect rent from peasants and pay revenue to be British Company.
- 2. The revenue to be collected was fixed with no scope of increase later.
- 3. This settlement ensured the regular income for the British Company.
- 4. Whatever remain with the zamindar after paying the revenue to the company was his profit

Draw back - The revenue that had been fixed was so high that zamindars found it difficult to pay. Anyone who failed to pay the revenue, lost his zamindari.
