The temperature decreases from South to the north. Days are warm and nights are cold .Frost is common in the north and the higher slopes of the Himalayas experience snowfall. A characteristic feature of the cold weather season over the northern plains is the inflow of cyclone disturbance from the west and the north west. Winter rainfall plays an important role in the cultivation of Rabi crops.

3. What causes rainfall during winters in the North Western part of India?

Ans: During the winter season north east trade winds prevail over India. They blow from land to sea and, hence ,for most part of the country it is a dry season. Western cyclonic disturbance cause winter rains over the plains and snowfall in the mountains. It is because in this region these winds blow from sea to land, there by carrying moisture along with them
