8.Do you think conservation of resources is important? Explain some methods of soil conservation.

Ans. Yes, conservation of resources is very important. Some methods of soil conservation are as follows.

- 1. Mulching- The bare ground between plants is conserved with a layer of organic matter like straw. It helps to retain soil moisture.
- 2.Intercropping- Different crops are grown in alternate rows and are sown at different times to protect the soil from rain wash.

- 3. Shelter belts- In the coastal and dry regions, rows of trees are planted to check the wind movement to protect soil cover.
- 4. Terrace farming- Broad flat steps or terraces are made on the steep slopes so that flat surfaces are available to grow crops. They reduce the surface run off and soil erosion.
- 5.Contour barriers- Stones, grass, soil are used to build barriers along contours. Trenches are made infront of barriers to collect water.

9. Read the source given below and answer the following questions.

The final wave of annexation occurred under Lord Dalhousie, who was the Governor- General from 1848- 1856. He devised a policy that came to be known as the 'Doctrine of Lapse'. One kingdom after another was annexed simply by applying this doctrine. Jhansi and Satara were annexed using this policy. Many Indian rulers and citizens saw it as unjust.

a. What do you mean by the 'Doctrine of Lapse'?

Ans. According to this policy, if an Indian ruler died without a male heir, his kingdom would lapse, that is become a part of Company's territory.

b.Do you think the Doctrine of Lapse was ethical? Why or why not?

Ans: No, it was unethical as it disregarded local customs and was used to expand British control unfairly.

c. How can you say that Rani Lakshmi Bai was affected by this policy?

Ans.Rani Lakshmi Bai had an adopted son. She wanted the company to recognize her adopted son as heir to the kingdom after the death of her husband but the British refused it.
