The Brahmaputra basin mainly covers the states of Assam and Arunachal Pradesh. Rice, tea and jute are the main crops grown here. Assam is the largest producer of tea. Dispur is the capital city and Guwahati is the largest city. Sericulture, that is the rearing of silk worms is practised in this state. Beautiful silk sarees are woven from Assam silk. Bihu, a harvest festival, is marked by dance and music. Itanagar is the capital of Arunachal Pradesh. The state is known for its bamboo and cane handicrafts. Main crops grown here are rice, maize, millet, wheat, pulses, sugarcane and oilseeds. Some of the important festivals celebrated are Chokhor, Losar, Torgya and Monpa.
