

A person is considered poor if his/ her income or consumption level falls below the given minimum level necessary to fulfill the basic needs. What is necessary to satisfy the basic needs is different at different times and in different countries. Therefore, the poverty line may vary with time and place. While determining the poverty line in India, a minimum level of food requirement, clothing, footwear, fuel and light, the educational and medical requirements etc are determined for subsistence. These physical quantities are multiplied by their prices in rupees.
